WHAT IMMORTAL HAND OR EYE,
COULD FRAME THY FEARFUL SYMMETRY?

IN WHAT DISTANT DEEPS OR SKIES.
BURNT THE FIRE OF THINE EYES?
ON WHAT WINGS DARE HE ASPIRE?
WHAT THE HAND, DARE SIEZE THE FIRE?

AND WHAT SHOULDER, & WHAT ART, COULD TWIST THE SINEWS OF THY HEART? AND WHEN THY HEART BEGAN TO BEAT, WHAT DREAD HAND? & WHAT DREAD FEET? WHAT THE HAMMER? WHAT THE CHAIN, IN WHAT FURNACE WAS THY BRAIN? WHAT THE ANVIL? WHAT DREAD GRASP, DARE ITS DEADLY TERRORS CLASP!

GAVE THEE CLOTHING OF DELIGHT,
SOFTEST CLOTHING, WOOLLY, BRIGHT;
GAVE THEE SUCH A TENDER VOICE,
MAKING ALL THE VALES REJOICE?
LITTLE LAMB, WHO MADE THEE?
DOST THOU KNOW WHO MADE THEE?

LITTLE LAMB, I'LL TELL THEE, LITTLE LAMB, I'LL TELL THEE. HE IS CALLED BY THY NAME, FOR HE CALLS HIMSELF A LAMB; HE IS MEEK AND HE IS MILD, HE BECAME A LITTLE CHILD I A CHILD, AND THOU A LAMB, WE ARE CALLED BY HIS NAME. LITTLE LAMB, GOD BLESS THEE, LITTLE LAMB, GOD BLESS THEE.

#### SAMUEL TAYLOR COLERIDGE

- ENGLISH ROMANTIC POET, LITERARY CRITIC AND PHILOSOPHER.
- BULLIED AS A CHILD.
- STUDIED AT CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY (NEVER GRADUATED).
- INFLUENCED BY FRENCH REVOLUTIONARY IDEAS.
- WORKS: <u>THE RIME OF THE ANCIENT</u>

DREAM-LIKE, MYSTERIOUS, DIDACTIC, DESCRIPTION OF A CRIME: CRIME, PUNISHMENT AND REDEMPTION.

#### KLUBA KHAN

INTENSE FOCUS ON NATURE AND EXOTIC PLACES, BASED ON A DREAM THE AUTHOR HAD.



- KUBLA KHAN
- IN XANADU DID KUBLA KHAN
  A STATELY PLEASURE-DOME DECREE:
  WHERE ALPH, THE SACRED RIVER RAN
  THROUGH CAVERNS MEASURLESS TO MAN,
  DOWN TO A SUNLESS SEA.
- SO TWICE FIVE MILES OF FERTILE GROUND WITH WALLS AND TOWERS WAS GIRDLED ROUND, AND THERE WERE GARDENS BRIGHT WITH SINUOUS RILLS WHERE BLOSSOMED MANY AN INCENSE-BEARING TREE; AND THERE WERE FORESTS ANCIENT AS THE HILLS, ENFOLDING SUNNY SPOTS OF GREENERY.
- BUT OH! THAT DEEP ROMANTIC CHASM THAT SLANTED DOWN A GREEN HILL ATHWART A CEDARN COVER! A SAVAGE PLACE! AS HOLY AND ENCHANTED AS E'ER BENEATH A WANING MOON WAS HAUNTED BY WOMAN WAILING FOR HER DEMON-LOVER! AND FROM THIS CHASM, WITH CEASELESS

TURMOIL SEETHING. AS IF THIS EARTH IN FAST THICK PANTS WERE BREATHING. A MIGHTY FOUNTAIN MOMENTLY WAS FORCED. AMIDST WHOSE SWIFT HALF-INTERMITTED BURST. HUGE FRAGMENTS VAULTED LIKE REBOUNDING HAIL. OR CHAFFY GRAIN BENEATH THE THREASHER'S FLAIL. AMD 'MIDST THIS TUMULT, AT ONCE AND EVER, IT FLUNG UP MOMENTLY THE SACRED RIVER: FIVE MILES MEANDERING WITH A MAZY MOTION. THROUGH WOOD AND DALE THE SACRED RIVER RAN. THEN REACHED THE CAVERNS MEASURELESS TO MAN. AND SANK IN TUMULT TO A LIFELESS OCEAN: AND 'MIDST THIS TUMULT KUBLA HEARD FROM AFAR, ANCESTRAL VOICES PROPHESYING WAR! THE SHADOW OF THE DOME OF PLEASURE FLOATED MIDWAY ON THE WAVES, WHERE WAS HEARD THE MINGLED MEASURE. FROM THE FOUNTAIN AND THE CAVES. IT WAS A MIRACLE OF RARE DEVICE:

A SUNNY PLEASURE-DOME WITH CAVES OF ICE!

A DAMSEL WITH A DULCIMER IN A VISION ONCE I SAW: IT WAS AN ABASYNNIAN MAID, AND ON HER DULCIMER SHE PLAYED. SINGING OF MOUNT ABORA. COULD I REVIVE WITHIN ME. HER SYMPHONY AND SONG, TO SUCH A DEEP DELIGHT 'TWOULD WIN ME. THAT WITH MUSIC LOUD AND LONG, I WOULD BUILD THAT PLEASURE-DOME. THAT SUNNY DOME! THOSE CAVES OF ICE! AND ALL WHO HEARD WOULD SEE THEM THERE AND ALL SHOULD CRY, BEWARE! BEWARE! WEAVE A CIRCLE ROUND HIM THRICE, AND CLOSE YOUR EYES WITH HOLY DREAD: FOR HE ON HONEYDEW HATH FED. AND DRUNK THE MILK OF PARADISE.
