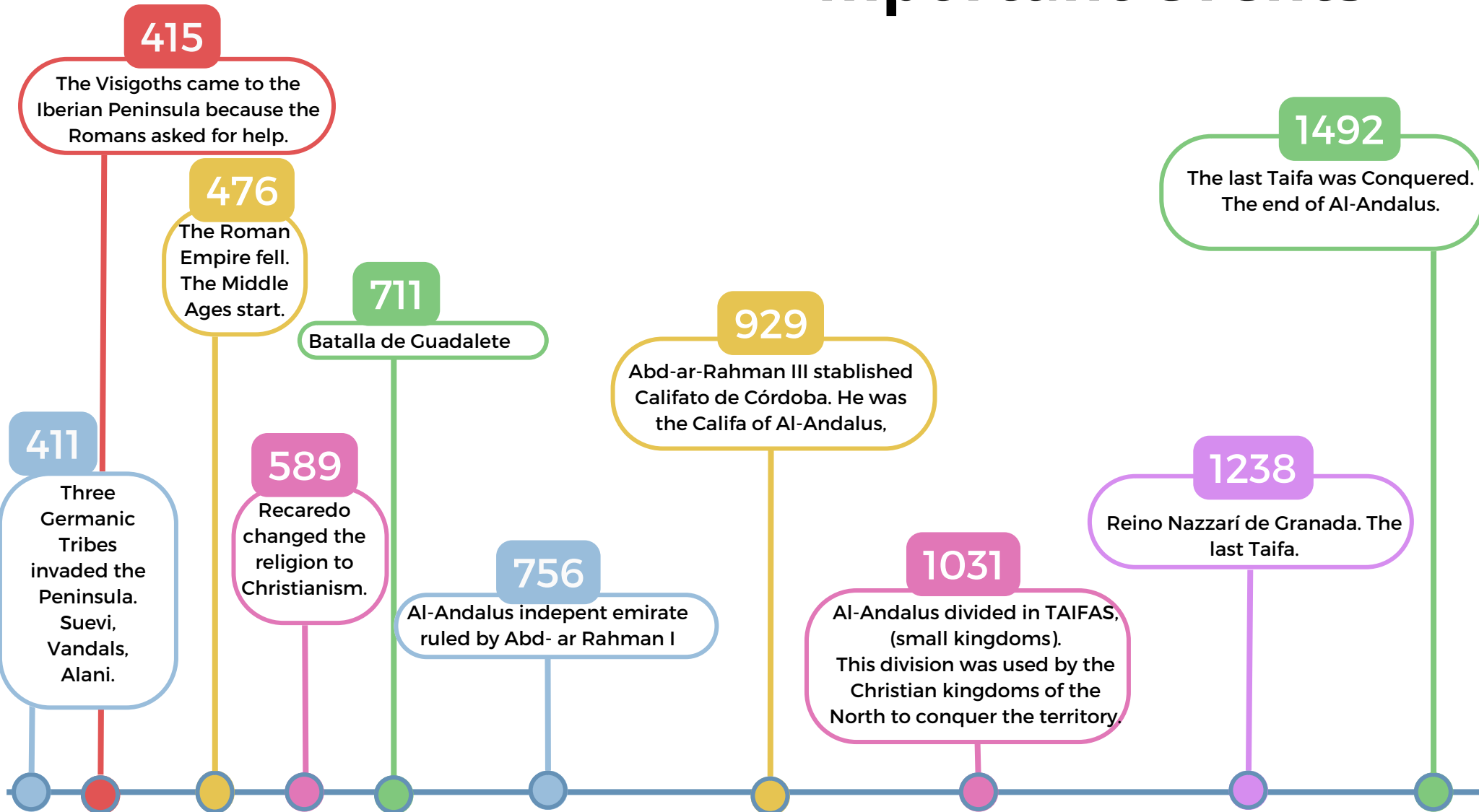


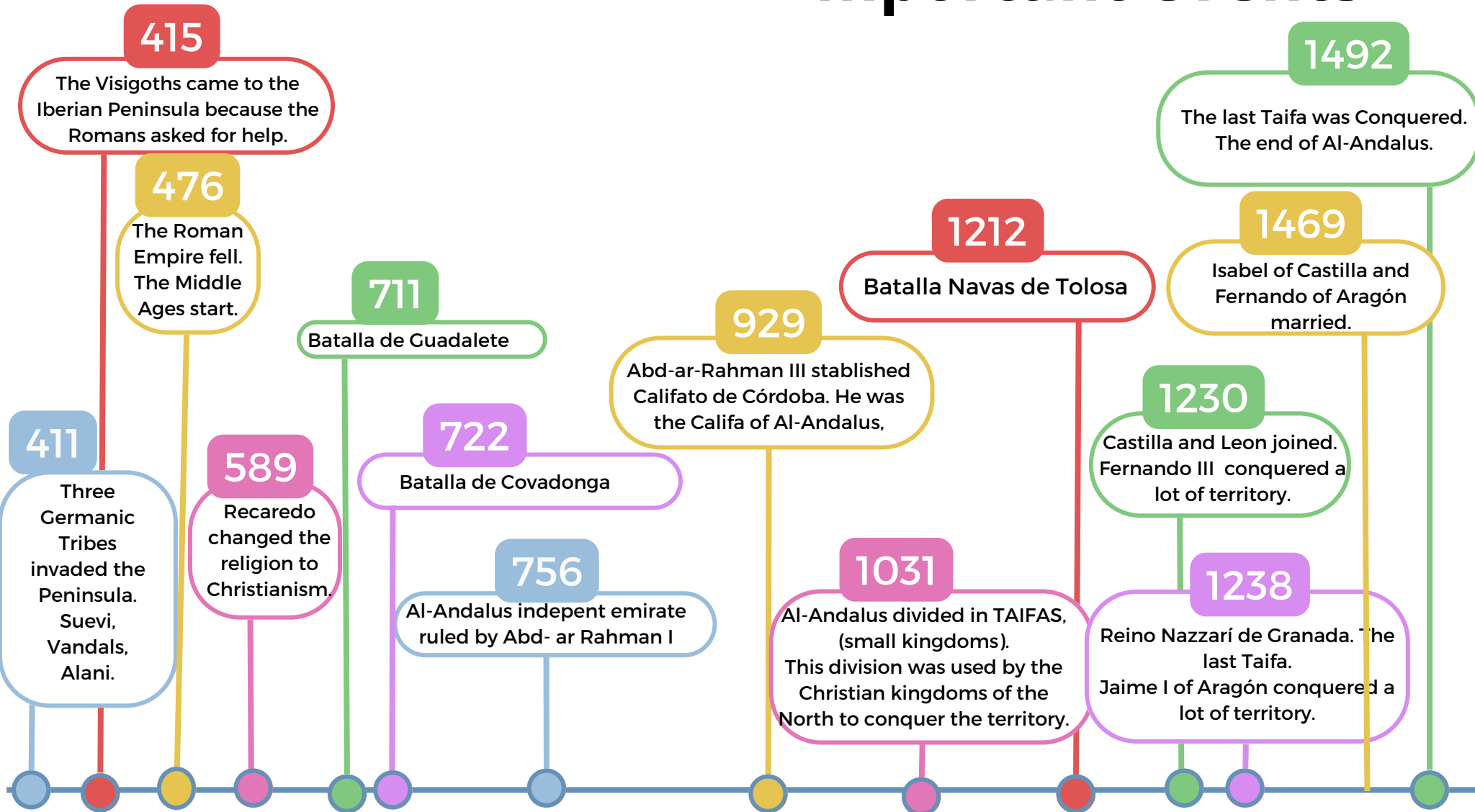

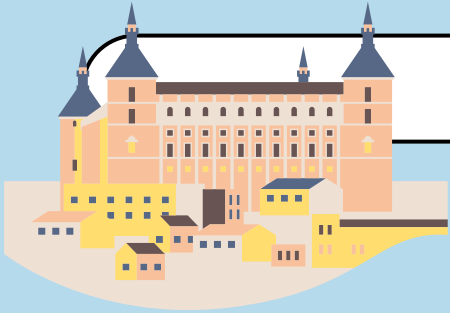

- There were jews living in the Peninsula too.



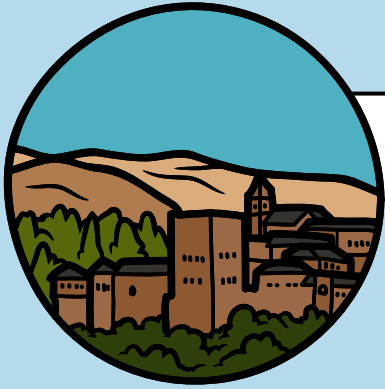
Capital

- They were excellent goldsmiths.

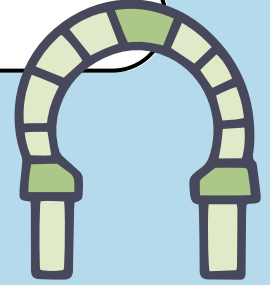


Visigoth churches had big walls and small windows. This is called Romanic

- A lot of words we use nowadays come from arabic.

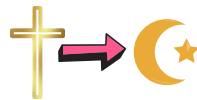
Religion

Jews that follow judaism. They also paid a tax.

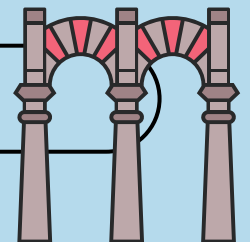


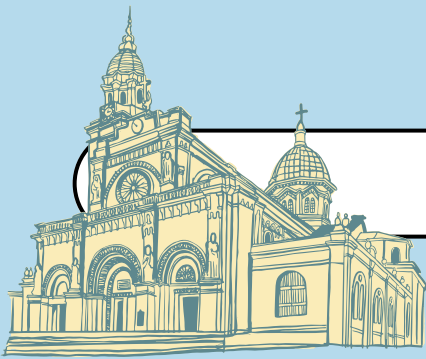
Capital

- They had mosques, public baths, libraries, hospitals and zocos.

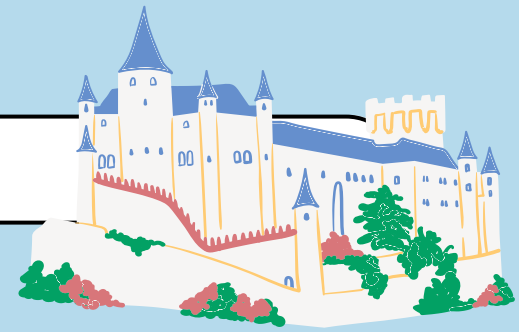
They brought new food like oranges, rice or aubergines.
