Martin Luther King Jr. was one of the most influential leaders of the American civil rights movement. He believed that peaceful protest could bring about social change. If he **hadn't fought** for equality, segregation laws in the United States might still exist today. His famous "I Have a Dream" speech inspired millions and challenged the injustice of racial discrimination. King was convinced that non-violent resistance was the key to justice. He often said that if we **responded** to hate with love, the world would be a better place. His legacy continues to influence global movements for equality.

Mahatma Gandhi led India to independence through non-violent civil disobedience. If Gandhi **had chosen violence**, history would have taken a very different path. Instead, he organized peaceful protests and hunger strikes to fight against British colonial rule. Gandhi believed that people could change the world through truth and nonviolence. His philosophy of *ahimsa*, or non-harming, has inspired countless activists. If more people **followed** Gandhi's example today, perhaps we **would see** less conflict in the world.

Greta Thunberg is a young environmental activist from Sweden. She began her campaign by striking outside the Swedish parliament to demand action on climate change. If Greta had stayed silent, the Fridays for Future movement might never have started. She argues that politicians must take urgent measures to protect the planet. Greta often uses social media to spread her message and connect with young people globally. If governments listened more carefully to scientists and young activists, we could reduce the damage caused by climate change.

Malala Yousafzai is a Pakistani activist for girls' education. When she was only 15, she was shot by the Taliban for defending her right to go to school. If Malala **had stopped speaking out**, millions of girls might not have access to education today. Instead, she became a global symbol of courage and hope. She won the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014, becoming its youngest recipient. If everyone **believed** in the power of education like Malala does, the world **would be** a fairer place.
