- * Ask teachers to join you in meetings. (Speak Spanish if necessary).
- * Create collaborative tools such as Padlet to promote the exchange of ideas.
 - * For complex projects such as Erasmus Plus, experienced teachers can help the less experienced ones in workshops.
- ❖ Get to know your teachers & their needs. Use John Tyler's idea of talking to one teacher 2 minutes for 10 days. Find out about their Communication Styles through a survey. (David Rawnsley)
- * Use What if.... Rethink Strategy to collect information from teachers. (From Kathryn Yamamoto's lesson)
