Literacy

- What is Literacy?
 - It is defined as the quality of being literate, that means, the ability of reading, writing and communicating using proper grammatical forms and vocabulary, in a coordinated way

- Why is the focus of the UK educational system set in Literacy?
 - Difficulties of the youngest generations in communicating using a specific and accurate language

Literacy

- UK's educational system solution was based in the following ideas:
 - 1. Every teacher should be a language teacher
 - 2. Creation of the Literacy Department
 - 3. Create a language environment in the building
 - 4. Incorporate certain methodologies (ex; Bloom's Taxonomy) to all the subjects






Strategies to develop Literacy in the High School
